Lost children will be transported to the Lost Children's Centre, located at the **Queen Elizabeth Building**. This Centre will be staffed by Police Officers and will care for the child until he/she is reunited with their guardian.

PARKING & TOWING



Designated Accessible Parking will be available at the Direct Energy Centre within the CNE grounds. Enter via Manitoba Drive/Strachan Avenue then south on Canada Boulevard to the entrance ramp of the Direct Energy Centre. A valid accessible parking permit must be displayed.

All vehicles including tour buses, parked illegally on:

- Lake Shore Boulevard West (including the grassed area);
- Bathurst Street;
- Fleet Street;
- King Street West;
- Queen Street West;
- Roncesvalles Avenue;
- Dufferin Street;
- The Queensway;
- and the Gardiner Expressway

WILL BE TAGGED AND TOWED!

Vehicles parked illegally in the Parkdale and Stadium Road areas will also be tagged and towed.

CHILDREN SAFETY

The best way to keep your kids safe is to watch them! If you can see them, you are in a good position to help them.

Take a picture of your child on the morning of the parade, so if they get lost, the police will have an up-to-date photo and description.

PREPARE FOR THE WEATHER

Check out these tips from Toronto Public Health and protect yourself against sun and heat exposure:

Bring a hat, wear sunscreen and drink lots of water.

Reduce sun exposure between 11AM and 4PM or when the UV index is 3 or higher.

Watch out for children or seniors who are more vulnerable to the heat and sun.

Keep newborns out of the sun. Sunscreen should be used on babies over the age of six months.

DRINK RESPONSIBLY

Please drink responsibly and according to the law. The only places you are allowed to consume alcohol are in approved, licensed areas.

Please ensure you have a designated driver in your group! Drinking and driving is against the law, and unacceptable!!

MIND THE FENCE!

It is very important to watch the parade from behind the fences in the approved viewing area. Entering onto the parade route is dangerous and brings the parade to a halt!

Stopping the flow of the parade may inhibit floats from entering the parade route by the Cut-Off time.

After the Cut-Off time, floats WILL NOT be allowed to enter onto the parade route.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The Scotiabank Caribbean Carnival is an exciting three week cultural celebration of music, cuisine, revelry as well as visual and performing arts. The Grand Parade will take place on August 2, 2014 and showcases elaborate costumes and floats inspired by the Caribbean culture accompanied by island music. Now in its 47th year, it has become a major international event and the largest cultural festival of its kind in North America.

The Toronto Police Service will attend the Parade and other related events in order to maintain a safe and secure atmosphere.

The Toronto Police Service will issue updates to the public, if necessary, through the media and through social media channels.

PUBLIC TRANSIT

Significant traffic disruptions are expected throughout the entire weekend. Various road closures will be announced in advance but members of the public are reminded to check their local media for last minute updates.

It is strongly recommended that anyone attending the Caribbean Carnival Parade or other related events should make use of public transit.

Frequent buses and streetcars will operate to Exhibition Place and the parade route on Lakeshore Boulevard:

- **511 Bathurst Southbound** from Bathurst Station to Exhibition Place
- **504 King** from Dundas West Station to Sunnyside Loop
- **29 Dufferin Southbound** from Dufferin Station to Dufferin Loop
- **509 Harbourfront** replacement bus from Union Station to Exhibition Place
- **Keele Station Express** bus to Parkside Drive & Lakeshore Boulevard
- **Lansdowne Station Express** bus via Jameson Avenue to Springhurst Avenue & Dunn Avenue

The TTC offers a Family/Group Day Pass for \$11.00 which includes:

- 1 adult and not more than 5 children/youth 19 years of age and under, OR
- 2 adults and not more than 4 children/youth 19 years of age and under, OR
- 2 adults.
