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INTRODUCTION

The Toronto Police Service publishes crime statistics based upon the number of reported offences whereas Statistics Canada publishes crime statistics based on reported incidents of crime. In the offence based statistics, all offences involved in an incident are included, whereas in the incident based statistics, more than one offence may be involved in one incident but only the most serious offence is included in the crime statistics. So care should be taken when comparing statistics published by the two agencies.

Types of Offences

Violent offences are crimes involving the application or threat of application of force to a person. These include homicide, homicide related offence, abduction, sexual assault, sexual offence, non-sexual assault and robbery.

Property offences involve unlawful acts with respect to property but do not involve the use or threat of violence against an individual. These may include theft, possession of stolen property, break and enter and fraud.

Other Criminal Code offences include the remaining non-traffic *Criminal Code* offences that are classified as neither violent nor property offences. Examples are prostitution, gaming and betting, mischief, offences against public order, bail violations.

Drug offences involve offences under the

Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. These offences comprise of possession, trafficking, importation or cultivation of various illicit, controlled and restricted drugs.

Other federal statute offences include violations under all other federal statutes. They include the Bankruptcy Act, Customs Act, Excise Act, Immigration Act.

Provincial Statute offences include all violations under provincial statutes excepting traffic related statutes. Examples are Coroner's Act, Environmental Protection Act, Mental Hospital Act and Liquor Licence Act. The majority of these offences come under Liquor Licence Act.

General Information

Due to system change, 'Fail to remain' violations, which form a major portion of Criminal Code traffic offences, are not available for publishing. As a result, care should be taken when comparing the total Criminal Code offences across years. It is recommended that Criminal Code offences *excluding traffic offences* should be taken for analyzing crime trends.

Offences published in a particular year include offences reported to police or became known to police during the year. However, offences occurred in the past can be reported in a future year. A typical example is the sexual assault category. Similarly, concluded offences include offences committed during previous years.

Overview of Statistics, 1999

- Reported **Criminal Code Offences excluding traffic offences** fell by 6.8% in 1999 over the previous year.
- **Violent crime** went down by 2.4% in 1999 from 1998.
- **Property crime** dropped 9.7% over the same period.
- **Other criminal Code Offences** decreased 3.9% in 1998 from 1997.
- There were 48 homicides in 1999 compared to 56 in 1998, a decrease of 14.3%. There were two (2) young offenders charged with homicide in 1999 compared to 39 adults charged.
- Sexual assaults increased 2.9%. About 51.0% of these offences were committed against persons under 18 years of age. There were 123 young offenders charged for the crime in 1999 compared to 122 in 1998.
- Total non-sexual assaults decreased by 2.7% in 1999 over 1998. Minor assaults which is about 75.0% of the crime decreased 3.9% while major assaults in the category increased 1.1%. There were 1723 young offenders charged for the crime in 1999 compared to 1624 in 1998.
- Total robbery decreased 4.8%; robbery to banks and financial institutions decreased 21.4% while purse snatching increased 11.8%.
- Break and enters to houses decreased 14.9%; entries to apartments dropped 7.3%.
- There were 12,600 motor vehicles reported stolen in 1999, representing an decrease of 2.9% from 1998. Out of the 657 persons charged for stealing motor vehicles, 253 were young offenders.
- Due to incomplete data input at press time, the 1999 traffic accident statistics were not available for publication. The 2000 annual report will have all collision statistics for 1999 published.
- There were 629 complaints lodged against police officers in 1999, compared to 619 in 1998.
- Number of vehicles stopped by R.I.D.E. (Reduced Impaired Driving Everywhere) increased in 1999 by 18.4% to 116,517. There were 16 traffic fatalities this year in Toronto involving alcohol.
- Total calls for service received at the Communications Centre increased 2.0% while the total dispatched calls for service decreased 4.8% in 1999 over 1998. The Service reaches out to wider sections of the community by providing service in languages other than English through the AT&T Language Line Service. In 1999 there were 2,664 calls for service received in 49 different languages.

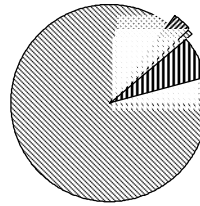

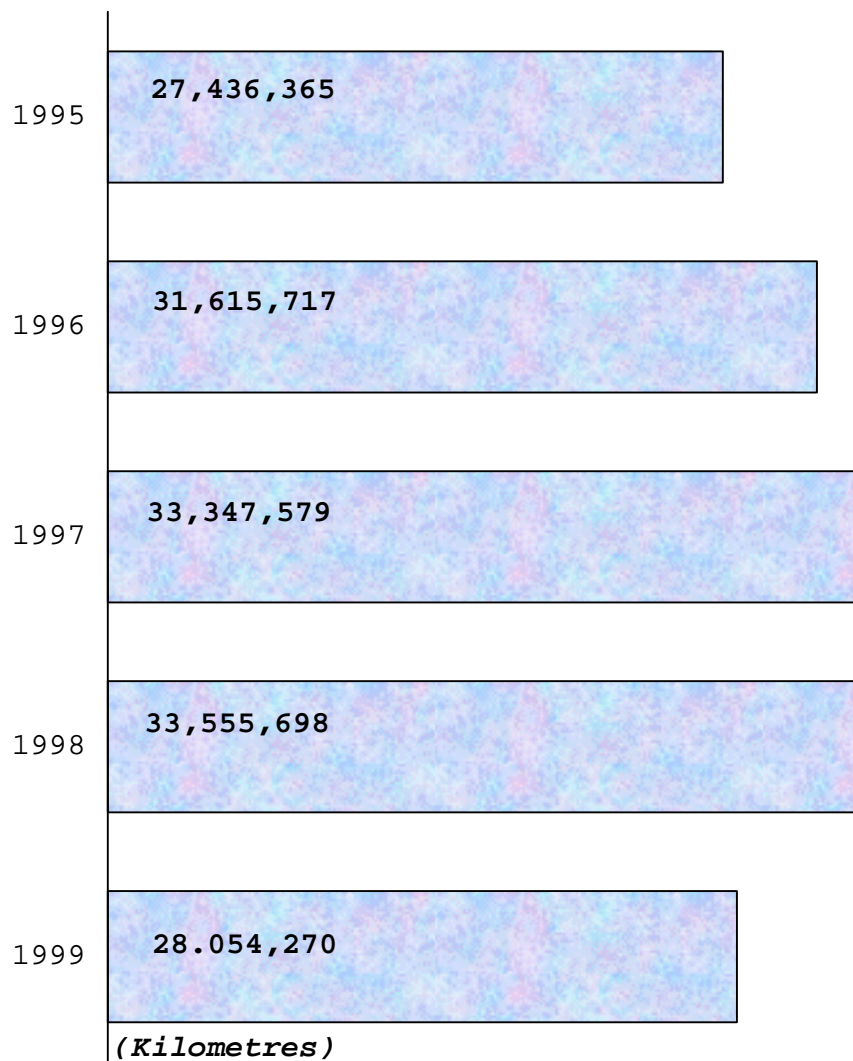

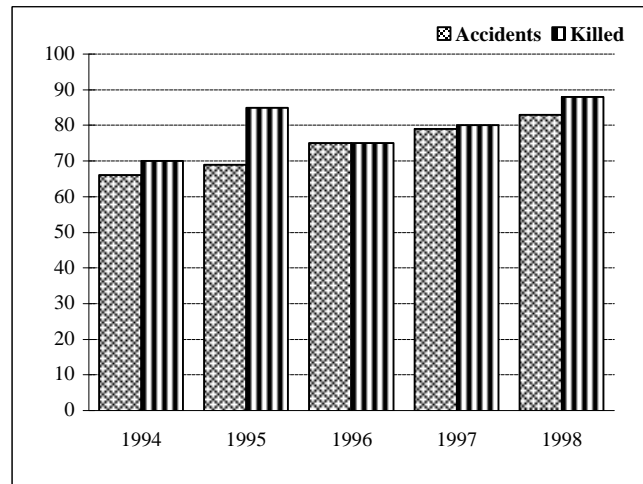

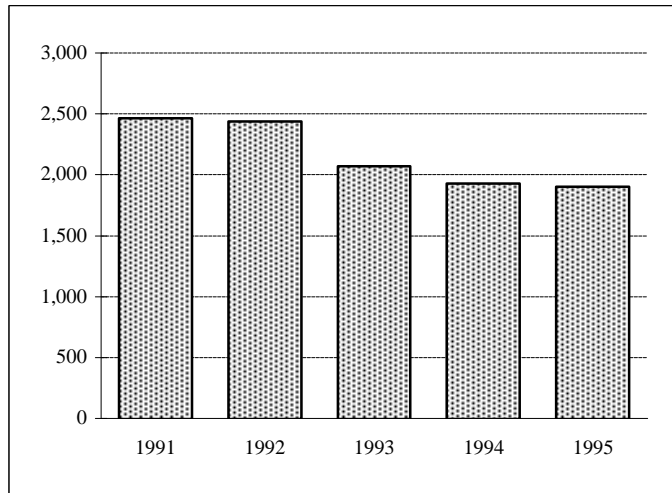
