The 42 Division Community is made up of representatives from the community, local businesses, schools, youth and officers from 42 Division Toronto Police. Our 42 Division CPLC Community is dedicated to increasing safety while enhancing security for the public. Through this partnership, our collective goal is to identify local community and policing concerns then develop and support the initiatives which will address them.

The CPLC Mandate is:

- To establish and maintain meaningful Community Police partnerships with local organizations, residents and youth
- To be proactive in community relations and crime prevention
- To assist in problem solving local police issues
- To act as a resource to the police and the community

What is the CPLC Scholarship?

The 42 Division CPLC Scholarship was created to recognize and provide financial support to a student living and attending school in our residential district. **\$2000** will be awarded to one student who has demonstrated leadership, academic achievement, and a commitment to their community.

Who Can Apply?

You must meet **all** of the following criteria:

- Live and attend school in the geographic area of 42 Division. 42 Division boundaries are: On the West – Victoria Park; On the East – the Scarborough/Pickering border; On the South – the 401; and on the North – the south side of Steeles Avenue East
- Must be graduating in **2018/2019**
- Have demonstrated commitment to co-curricular activities and community service
- Currently enrolled, or enrolled within the last year, in a full-time, recognized academic secondary school
- Have been accepted by and will be enrolling in a post-secondary institution in **2019**

Who is NOT eligible?

Person(s) related to a CPLC member

Person(s) related to members of Toronto Police Services

Person(s) who do not live or attend school in 42 Division

How Do I Apply?

Complete the attached application form and submit the application and all required documents by **May 21st, 2019**. Completed applications are to be sent to:

The successful candidate will be expected to attend the 42 Division CPLC Annual Picnic on Saturday, June 8th, 2019 where they will receive their award.
